



## **Emily Nock** 2021 Chief of Staff

A native Marylander, Emily joined the Salisbury Jaycees in 2011 to help with the annual Christmas Parade. Though unsure of what to initially expect, Emily quickly fell in love with the organization, chairing her first project in 2012 and becoming the chapter's Community Development Vice President in 2013. In 2014, she was elected Chapter President. Under her leadership, the Salisbury Jaycees were named the top chapter in the state and were also awarded the Clarence H. Howard Memorial Award for being one of the Most Outstanding Chapters in the Country. Emily herself was named the top recruiter in the state and also awarded the Charles Kulp Jr Memorial Award for being among the most outstanding chapter presidents. That year she also served on the JCI USA Strategic Planning Committee and attended her first national event, quickly forming bonds across the country.

In 2015, Emily served as Maryland Jaycee Membership Vice President and a member of the Training Task Force for JCI USA. The following year, she served as JCI Program Manager for LLS, State Director for the Salisbury Jaycees, and Executive Vice President for the Maryland Jaycees. She was awarded the R Bradley Trafton Memorial Award for Outstanding State Officer and elected as the 77th President of the Maryland Jaycees for 2017. In October of that year, she was also bestowed with honor of being named a JCI USA Ambassador. In 2018 she served as a National Vice President and was also honored as Senator #77392. The following year, Emily once again served on the National Board as the Membership Development Director, helping to coordinate incentives for the year, bring in new membership benefits, and also founding the organizations first podcast channel, Howl Time. Her time on the national level was continued in 2020 when she served as the Chapter Development Director overseeing the committee in charge of extensions, newly formed chapters, rebuilds, and relaunches.

Outside of the Jaycees, Emily is President of the Nock Insurance Agency, where she has served in an executive position for over 15 years. She is also very active in the community serving on the Salisbury Jaycees Foundation Board, the Ocean City Board of Zoning Appeals and the Board of Directors for the Delmarva Chapter of the Red Cross. She is also the President of the American Legion Auxiliary Synepuxent Unit 166. In her spare time, she enjoys spending time with friends and family, traveling, and being out on the water.
